At the end of America's involvement in the Korean Conflict, our troops returned to the USA by ship, arriving at Navy yards along the Pacific coast. They were transported to their state-side posts in specially made troop sleeper cars that had been built during WWII. These cars were pulled at the front of regular passenger trains along with special troop kitchen cars that fed the soldiers and sometimes special troop hospital cars that carried the wounded. The troop cars did not have access to the rest of the train.
