In the early 1960's the Rock Island made a deal to merge with the Union Pacific. This deal was held up by U.S. government agencies for over 18 years while questions regarding anti-trust were studied to death.

What really ended up happening was the government studied the Rock Island to death. During those years, the railroad continued to operate at a loss, neglecting maintenance of track and equipment. In the end, the UP backed out of the deal because the Rock Island no longer had marketable value.
